Gospel Reading (Luke 6:27–38)

Jesus teaches his disciples to be merciful as God is merciful.

Today's gospel reading is a continuation of the teaching that began in last Sunday's gospel. We continue to

hear Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Recall that in Luke's Gospel, this teaching is addressed to Jesus' disciples. This is in contrast to the parallel found in Matthew's Gospel, the Sermon on the Mount, in which Jesus' words are addressed to both the disciples and to the crowds.

These words from Jesus' teaching are familiar to us. They constitute the crux and the challenge of what it means to be a disciple: Love your enemies, turn the other cheek, give to those who ask, do unto others, lend without expecting repayment, judge not lest you be judged.

There are several similarities between Luke's and Matthew's report of Jesus' great teaching. Both begin with the <u>Beatitudes</u>. Matthew includes nearly all the content that Luke does; the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's Gospel is longer than Luke's Sermon on the Plain. There are, however, differences in language and nuance. For example, Matthew presents this portion of the teaching as a contrast between Jesus' teaching and the teachings of the law and the prophets. This is in keeping with Matthew's concern to address his predominantly Jewish audience. It is likely that Luke omits this contrast because it was unnecessary for the Gentile believers for whom Luke is writing.

Another point of contrast between Matthew and Luke's presentation is the terminology. In Luke, Jesus contrasts the behavior of his followers with the behavior of "sinners." In Matthew, Jesus contrasts the behavior desired with the behavior of tax collectors and Gentiles. Matthew concludes the teaching about love of enemies with the admonition to be perfect as God is perfect; Luke concludes by emphasizing God's mercy.

In both Gospels, Jesus' words challenge those who would follow him to be more like God. God loves us beyond our expectations, beyond anything we can possibly imagine. In response to God's love, we are to love as God loves, beyond expectations and with a depth beyond imagining.

The Fourth Core Directives.....

(iv) Strong Pastoral Leadership in the Parish which Promotes Diverse & Collaborative Roles of Pastoral Service.



The pastor serves as the spiritual shepherd of his people by guiding the flock in its journey, most notably in preparing and celebrating the Eucharist for his parishioners.

To strengthen the parish family, he requires the support of qualified laity serving in diverse pastoral roles, i.e. lectors, servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, ushers, etc. The pastor models a collaborative style of leadership that provides a prudent, clear and pastoral vision for the parish. It is important that the pastor have an ability to listen, and to be approachable and open to explore new initiatives put forward by the parishioners, lay associations and movements, if they are in accord with the parish vision. The pastor and parish team will strive to empower parishioners to carry out diverse and collaborative pastoral roles as deacons, lay ministers, youth workers, catechists, parish staff, and volunteers. Through regular consultation and discernment, the pastor identifies the gifts and talents of others and entrusts to them various initiatives within the parish.

Note on the Indigenous Reconciliation Efforts

Since the last Archdiocesan Update, there have been a number of developments on the Indigenous reconciliation effort. All this information is on the Archdiocese of Toronto's website, but in case you missed it: Canada's bishops provided more information on the national \$30 million reconciliation fund; the Indigenous delegation to Rome has been rescheduled for the week of March 28; and the Archdiocese of Toronto committed to raising \$6 million for the national fund.
