Sunday Reflection....

Jesus teaches what it means to be happy.

(Matthew 5:1-12a)




Today's reading is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which is found in Matthew's Gospel. The form of the Beatitudes found here is not unique to Jesus. Beatitudes are found in the Old Testament, in the psalms, and in wisdom literature, for example. They are a way to teach about who will find favor with God.

We quickly note in this reading that the people whom Jesus calls "blessed" and "happy" are not people we think of as blessed or happy . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. This Gospel is one of reversals. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.

"Blessed" is sometimes translated as *happy, fortunate*, or *favored*. In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favor is upon those who are poor, those who mourn, those who are persecuted. This news might have been welcome—and surprising—to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. By referring to the good things that the faithful will experience, Matthew reminds us that those who act in the manner described in the Beatitudes will find their reward with God.



World Day of the Sick Saturday, 11 February 2023

"Take care of him" - Compassion as a synodal exercise of healing

In today's world, how often do we see or hear the sick experiencing deep loneliness and abandonment? In our families and close-knit circles, we can be particularly confronted by our human fragility and vulnerability, especially when a loved

one falls ill or grows older. Pope Francis, in his message for this year's World Day of the Sick, reminds us that it only "takes a moment of our attention, of being moved to compassion within us" to overcome the throwaway culture and bring loving tenderness to someone in need. The Parable of the Good Samaritan reminds us of our call to approach, listen, and tend proactively to the sick. The Samaritan does not 'do it alone,' but asks the Innkeeper for help and says, "care for him." Face-to-face encounters are essential avenues for the healing ministry of the living Christ. As a faith-filled community, let us not be indifferent to suffering and find ways to pray for and accompany the sick, lonely and abandoned.

Our Lady of Lourdes, Health of the Sick, we entrust to you all who are sick, those who care for them within their families, through work, research or volunteer services. Inspired by your merciful care, may the Church walk together with the sick as a sign of humanity in which everyone is precious and wherein no one is discarded or left behind. Amen.

REPAIRS UPDATES:

RAMPS REPAIRS: We are on the process of fixing/replacing the existing concrete steps and ramps around the church as they do not meet the Ontario Building Code Standards or AODA standards. The estimated price for this project is \$250k. I will make a complete report to the community as soon as the information are available.

<u>SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS:</u> We are also on the process of updating our surveillance cameras. The cost of this project is \$23,020 + tax.

N.B. The Chancery Office and the Parish Finance Committee must approved these projects.

Significant issues identified by the EXP report in July 2019 and the Parish Finance Council will require careful planning in the coming years. The most significant of these include 4 are:

- 1. <u>Masonry Repair</u> The EXP report documents significant masonry deterioration at many areas of the building. Priority areas should be repaired immediately to prevent debris from falling, but a long term masonry repair plan should be developed.
- 2. <u>Foundation Repair</u> The EXP report documents several foundation cracks. TMS conducted some waterproofing work below the rectory. An extensive foundation repair and waterproofing project should be planned around the parish hall.
- 3. <u>Electrical Deficiencies</u> There are numerous electrical deficiencies noted in the EXP report and visible onsite that need to be corrected. Inappropriate wiring, improperly terminated wiring, open junction boxes, missing/broken exit signs, missing/inadequate emergency lighting need to be resolved.
- 4. Fire Alarm System The OFC requires Assembly Occupancy buildings as large as Our Lady of the Assumption to have a fire alarm system. It is at the jurisdiction of the Fire Department when and if to issue a compliance notice. Had a permit been applied for, this review may have triggered a request to include a fire alarm system. A system should be added as soon as is feasible.

SACRISTANS VOLUNTEER NEEDED

Sacristans are confirmed active Catholics trained to oversee preparation and clean-up in liturgical celebrations. The sacristan's duties vary, but usually include taking care of the sacristy and the sacred items therein; performing duties before, during and after Mass; and training altar servers. To prepare for Mass, the sacristan ensures that the priest has the vessels, linens, candles, liturgical books, and sufficient fresh hosts and wine required for the Mass; sets the offertory table for the Presentation of the Gifts; sets the credence table; and confirms the presence of all required ministers. When there is a special ceremony at Mass, such as a Baptism, the sacristan sets out the required additional items. If no altar servers are present, the sacristan must either find substitute servers in the congregation or personally assume that position. Before, during and after Mass, the sacristan manages the church lighting and PA system. After Mass, the sacristan oversees the cleaning of vessels, altar, credence table and sacristy area; supervises the transfer of parishioner donations to the safe: and stores all items.

Liturgical Coordinators' Meeting


