Reflect on the Past, Embrace the Present, and Shape the Future

Reflection on the Divine Mercy



Divine Mercy is the heart of the Gospel — the expression of God's unfathomable love poured out for a broken world. At its core, it is not just a devotion or an image, but the very nature of God, who desires not our condemnation, but our healing.

When we reflect on the Divine Mercy, particularly through the image revealed to St. Faustina, we are invited to trust in Jesus completely — *"Jesus, I trust in You."* These words are simple, yet they challenge the deepest fears and wounds we

carry. They are not a passive surrender, but an active choice to believe that no sin is too great, no soul too lost, and no darkness too deep for God's mercy to reach.

The rays in the Divine Mercy image — red for His blood, white for water — symbolize the sacraments that sustain us: the Eucharist and Baptism, but also the grace of Reconciliation. Mercy, then, is not only something we receive; it's something we are called to live and extend.

In a world that often seeks justice through punishment, the Divine Mercy calls us to forgive, to show compassion, and to remember that everyone is more than their worst moment. In the words of Jesus to St. Faustina: "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy." This is the scandal and beauty of God's love.

So we ask ourselves: Do I trust in God's mercy for my own failures? Do I extend that mercy to others — especially those who least seem to deserve it? Am I a channel of peace, or do I cling to resentment?


