Reflection on the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord



The Feast of the Ascension, celebrated forty days after Easter, marks the moment when the risen Jesus ascended into heaven in the presence of His disciples. It is a powerful and profound mystery that speaks not of absence, but of **fulfillment**, **hope**, **and mission**.

At first glance, the Ascension may seem like a farewell—a moment of loss for the disciples who had only recently regained the presence of the risen Christ. But in truth, it is a moment of transformation. Jesus' return to the

Father is not a departure in the human sense, but rather the beginning of a new way of being present: through the Holy Spirit, in the Church, and in the hearts of believers.

Christ's Ascension is a promise. He ascends not to leave us behind, but to go before us—to prepare a place for us. His glorification is our destiny too. He takes our humanity into heaven, showing us that eternal life with God is not only possible but is the purpose for which we were created.

Moreover, the Ascension is a **commissioning**. Before ascending, Jesus tells His disciples: "You will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8). This is not a passive waiting for Christ's return, but a call to active participation in His mission—to proclaim the Good News, to love as He loved, and to build the Kingdom of God here and now.

As we reflect on the Ascension, we are reminded to lift our eyes to heaven, but also to keep our feet on the ground—serving, loving, and witnessing in the world. Christ is with us always, just as He promised, through the Holy Spirit who empowers and guides us.

As we celebrate our 75th Anniversary, we are purchasing a 5ft Statue of Our Lady of the Assumption to be blessed


